### **Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005**

**Application for Occasional Licence – Wednesday 13th June, Thursday 14th June and Friday 15<sup>th</sup> June 2018 with hours of 12 midday to 11 p.m. each day.**

With reference to the above subject I object to the granting of this application for the following reason.

The applicant is applying to operate a Pop Up Pub in an empty shop premises at 48 Market Place, Selkirk during the Selkirk Common Riding Celebrations.

The Wednesday and Thursday evenings and all day Friday at the common riding are particularly busy within the town center area with various celebrations centered within that area. The area is already well served by licensed premises for both On and Off sales of alcohol.

It is unlikely that the proposed Pop Up Pub would come up to the standard required to be on sale licensed premises, by the Planning authority, Building Standards or Environmental Health, without substantial refurbishment and alteration, the most obvious example to support this assumption being the provision of one single toilet facility. As such in my opinion the premises would be unfit for the proposed purpose on the dates requested and the application should be refused under terms of Section 59(6)(d) of the Act.
