In recent years we have mainly focused on growing our junior section with as many as fifty boys and girls taking part on junior coaching nights.
benefits it brings to the local community:	We have also focused on the club becoming more community and family spirited with regular 'Family Days and BBQs' taking place when parents/grandparents and children can all play (soft ball) cricket together in an enjoyable and safe environment.
	As part of this initiative we also undertook a series of 'DIY Days' with the aim of refurbishing our clubhouse. This involved children, parents and senior players repainting and upgrading the pavilion. The cost of this was met from our own funds along with the generous support of many sponsors.
	Looking ahead we hope to consolidate on the recent growth in children participating on junior nights and improve upon the on-field facilities we have at our disposal. Recently we have purchased a new mobile net and junior bowling machine (the latter have been purchased via a grant from the Cricket Development Trust and a short term interest-free loan provided by a member). Already this has made a vast difference to the quality, safety and enjoyment of our junior sessions.
	Over many years we have spent a great deal of time attempting to improve the standard of our wicket and outfield. As with most sports clubs this requires the use of heavy and quite expensive equipment and this needs ongoing maintenance and in some instances replacement.

	Much of our ground-keeping equipment now needs replaced/re-conditioned; for example our heavy roller had to be scrapped a few year ago. Rolling the square is a vital part of maintaining a 'true' and well-conditioned wicket (for obvious reasons). We are now faced with a significant capital outlay which is well beyond the means of the cricket club as things stand.
