



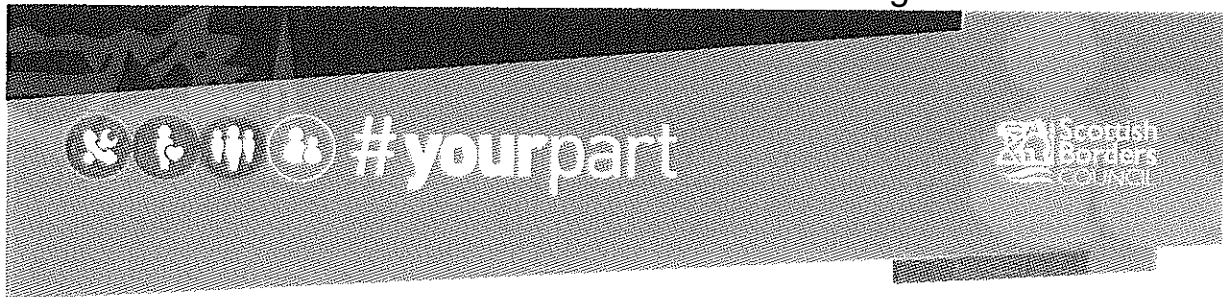

### **Common Good Funds**

Common Good Funds in Scotland originated in the 15th century and are the assets and income of some of the former Burghs. They can represent a substantial portfolio of land, property, some moveable items and investments and by law continue to exist for the benefit of the inhabitants of the former Burghs to which they relate. Scottish Borders Council is the owner of these Funds and each Fund has a sub-committee comprising the relevant local Councillors who make the decisions on the management of the Fund's assets and approval of any requests for funding (up to a limit of £20,000 above which full Council approval is required).

If you are successful in being awarded Common Good Funds, you will be asked to complete a monitoring & evaluation form when your project is complete or within 1 year of receiving funding. Future applications will not be considered until this has been received and the Common Good Fund Sub-Committee are satisfied with the evaluation you have provided.

Kelso over 60s club has been running for a number of years and our main objective is to keep our members active and encourage them to get out the house as much as possible, we organise events and trips to allow them to feel involved in the community and not self-isolated, our members health and wellbeing are the key priorities and we want everyone to have a positive experience from attending our events.

Everyone over 60 is welcome from the Kelso area and we do not have any barriers to joining our club. We hold regular events throughout the year with the highlight being the annual Christmas lunch held in Ednam house hotel and nearly always in the company of Lady Jane Grosvenor our Patron.

Our members always look forward to this event where they receive a lovely meal, a dance and a free raffle where everyone receives a present, like everything just now prices have risen and a donation from the Kelso Common good fund would allow us to continue to provide these vital services and make the Christmas lunch possible.

We always have reasonable funds towards the end of the year but this is to allow us to be in a position to pay our account to the hotel the day after our event. We have had a donation from the Common good several times but we feel it is a very worthy cause and for some it is the highlight of the year.

Our committee are all volunteers who give up their time to run the club for the benefit of others, and we have been very active supporting older people for many years, with energy costs and food prices rising dramatically its vital services like ours continue to support the elderly throughout the year
