Mr Wynne, Licensing Standards and Enforcement Officer advised that the application referred to the Driftwood Bar within the Eyemouth Holiday Park and the application was to bring their operating plan up to date, as detailed above. Mr Wynne referred specifically to the wording regarding children and young persons at question 6, and to the amendment to ensure that access and times referred to supervised children and Young Persons that were staying at the Holiday Park or were attending an event or dining.

The Convener welcomed, Chloe Crawford, Legal Representative; Damon Gaunt, Complex Manager and Andrew Kemp, Licensing Manager to the meeting. Miss Crawford explained that the premises had been licensed for some time and the proposed alterations were to update the operating plan to allow Breakfast Service, with no alcohol, within the Bar Area, extending the hours, activities, seasonal alterations and to amend the wording in connection to children and young persons.
