In addition, with an aging population we need to be fit for purpose, and having accessible equipment enhances the prospects for regular participation.

We would like to upgrade our current disability pool hoist at Selkirk, which would allow even the severely disabled and those who are elderly or with mobility issues to access the pool. This project would allow us and other local community groups to provide a range of aquatic sports and or causal recreation swimming which will aid regular exercise. The proposed hoist upgrade is aimed at reaching out to numerous community groups, schools, families and carers across the area. This initiative safeguards customer independence and increases aquatic participation in a discrete and user friendly manner.

This upgrade would make a significant difference for swimmers with a disability in the Selkirk area.
