At the Annual General Meeting all the directors retire, but being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

GRANT FUNDING

The directors and the management committee gratefully acknowledge the support of Awards for All in providing funding totalling £8,770 for the purchase of equipment to help make the Hawick Reivers Festival more cost-effective and sustainable. The equipment consists of drapes for use in staging musical and theatrical performances, gazebos, and tables and chairs. We are also grateful for the award of £4,922 under the Scottish Borders Council Community Grants Scheme to improve the marketing of the festival. This money will be spent mainly in financial year 2016-17 and will include the development of a new website. We are also very grateful for the continuing financial support from the Hawick Common Good Fund (£2,500 in 2015-16) towards the running costs of the festival. Without this support it would be very difficult to continue to stage the festival.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015).

Grants

Grants receivable in respect of expenditure incurred during the year are included in the income and expenditure account. Grants received in respect of future expenditure are deferred and matched against the expenditure in the year it is incurred. Grants received in respect of capital expenditure are deferred and released to the income and expenditure account over a period that matches the depreciation of the related fixed assets.

Investment Income

Bank interest is accounted for when receivable.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.
