STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Charity's aims are to promote all elements of music and musicianship in a way that is affordable and inclusive, to benefit the whole community, especially those who are directly affected by poverty, ill health and rural isolation.

The objects of the Charitable Company are to carry on activities which benefit the community and in particular (without limitation) to create a dedicated space for the study and practice of a broad spectrum of music and music related disciplines from the diverse traditions of the world.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2014

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Significant activities

The Charity offers one to one tuition in a range of instruments. Students are also encouraged to participate in weekend group sessions in order to experience and benefit from playing with other musicians. These group sessions have increase to nine groups playing various styles of music.

The Charity has held workshops and percussion sessions at various events along with student performances in the local area, and at their premises.

Nomad Beat Ltd had a funding application pending at the year end to finance the purchase of specialist equipment and training in its use to enhance services for those with additional needs. The Trustees are delighted to confirm that on the 26th of November 2014 it was announced that the funding had been successful.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Plans are being discussed to work together with: Peebles Eastgate Theatre, Eddelston Choir, a local clarsach player, Peebles Burgh Silver Band and Tweeddale Pipe Band to create an event for Peebles Creative Place 2014. Workshops and collaboration with local visual artists are also being confirmed.

The Charity is now an Accredited Examination Centre for RSAMD exams.

Thirteen students were presented in June 2013 for a range of graded examinations and all attained very good pass marks.

The charity is now also accredited as the first ABRSM exam centre in the Scottish Borders for examinations in classical and jazz music. The charity is also in the process of negotiating with the Rock School exam board working towards accreditation for their exams.

Sixteen Nomad Beat students have also passed Rock School and SQA exams.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

All reserves held are for the future running of the Charity.

GOING CONCERN

In common with many charities, funding is dependent on a number of variables and is far from guaranteed. The trustees note that the fundraising activities and grant applications are progressing, which will ensure that the company will continue for the foreseeable future.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Nomad Beat Ltd

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2014 set out on pages four to eleven.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

Grant income that is restricted for the purchase of fixed assets is shown in the balance sheet as deferred income and released to the SOFA at the same rate as the depreciation of those assets purchased

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Music equipment

- 20% on reducing balance

Fixtures and fittings

- 33% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
