This project was first conceived over a year ago by the residents of No's 43 to 50 Broomlea to utilise the plot of vacant land at the end of our cul-de-sac and turn it into a community garden.

As well as benefitting the local community it also reduces the area of grassed land required to be maintained by SBC, this is supported in principle by Neil Hastie, Estates Manager SBC.

- We have also been supported by Kelso Community Councillors Simon Mountford and Euan Robeson and Kelso Provost Dean Weatherston.
- Kelso Community Council have sponsored our planning application by paying the fee of £280.50
- PGL Design have provided the necessary planning documentation free of charge
- The Planning Application has been submitted to SBC.
- The Heads of Terms for the Lease have been agreed with SBC Estates and
- The Association has written and agreed a constitution and appointed a Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer.

- As we are a new group with no funds, we are unable to submit a set of audited accounts.
- After the initial set-up costs the annual outlay per household will be approximately £25.00 to cover insurance and maintenance. Each household will pay for their own plants and seeds for their individual plot.
- Given the small amount of money the Association requires to cover its annual costs we would prefer not to open a bank account if at all possible. We will however be able to provide receipts for any purchases we make as per the attached costing document.
