Dear Councillors, I am writing on behalf of Selkirk Community Council and as a member of the Walking Festival Steering Group to request financial assistance towards the running of the Scottish Borders Walking Festival which will take place in Selkirk and the Yarrow & Ettrick Valleys in September this year. This will be the 25th Walking Festival and the organisers are keen to make this a most memorable year.

We are requesting assistance of up to £1,000 which will be used for website development. We have budgeted £1,000 for this vital tool which is used for promotion, marketing and online bookings.

As you will see from the accompanying budget the festival is being supported by Selkirk Community Council (up to £1,000 towards transport costs) and Ettrick & Yarrow Community Council (£1,500.00).
