Activities

Please supply a brief description of the activities of your organisation and the benefits it brings to the local community:

The Knowepark Parent Partnership consists of parent volunteers who work together to support the school in a variety of ways.

We organise regular fundraising events so that we can provide the school with new play and teaching resources as well as subsidising the cost of school trips so that all classes can enjoy an inspiring educational experience out-with the school environment. This session we have donated over £2500 towards trips, nursery equipment, playground toys and classroom resources.

The KPP hold termly meetings with management staff, working closely with them both to represent parental viewpoints within school decision making and to help the school to strengthen links with the parent community. The link between parental engagement and pupil success is well documented and the Parent Partnership play a key role in helping the school to develop this. We can also speak on behalf of the school and for the parents when issues arise which need to be raised with SBC.

Finally, the KPP works to bring local businesses and community members into partnership working with the school. Recently local businesses have donated time and skills to the first stage of our playground improvements. We have also engaged with Developing the Young Workforce to widen pupil access to work-related educational opportunities within the town.

The outside area at Knowepark Primary School is almost entirely tarmac and the Parent Partnership has already started making improvements as part of a large-scale vision to transform the outdoor spaces at the school to provide greater opportunities for pupils to connect with nature, grow edibles and benefit from high quality outdoor education.

This next phase of our plans will transform a section of underused playground into a professionally designed, organic, sustainable edible growing space. Pupils will be actively engaged with growing and using the produce. Class visits, staff training & volunteer input will promote deeper experiential learning and inspire a school-wide food quality and waste reduction ethos.

During a series of work days supported by parent volunteers and local organisations we will build large wooden planters for fruit trees, soft fruits, herbs, salads and other small edibles. The planting has been professionally designed to be productive within the school calendar and to be low maintenance and hardy. All the growing will be organic.

There are several skilled tradespeople within the parent community to help lead this part of the project and Scottish Gas Network Community Action Programme have offered us a squad of workers for two days of labour and the use of their plant machinery in kind, adding huge value to the budget.

We will install a wormery as well as tumbling and fixed compost bins to allow the school to tackle food waste education and provide a sustainable source of compost and plant food. As funds become available, we will add a shed for storage and a greenhouse to allow pupils to grow edible plants from seed.

Working in partnership with Royal Highland Education Trust we will provide class farm visits, school-based workshops relevant to our project and staff training on how to deliver high quality cookery lessons.

Upper school pupils will be responsible for the regular maintenance of the garden which will provide a much-needed resource for outdoor learning and teaching about sustainability, science and technology. The garden will not only provide the school with a hub for outdoor learning but will generate opportunities for cooking produce, selling it at a pop-up shop or school café event, and even making more use of the rejuvenated area of the school grounds for school and community events.

The Parent Partnership is committed to providing a minimum annual funding of £300 to maintain and develop the garden.

The project will bring benefits to all involved, offering parents, carers and the local community a chance to become more involved in the life of the school and providing children with the opportunity to help design, build, plant and take ownership of their garden.
