<u>NOTE</u>:- For the avoidance of doubt a private pre-arranged function is where the premises or a specific room in the premises is given over to a previously arranged private function which is attended by invitation and is not accessible to the general public, if a specific room then children and young person access is restricted to the specific room and access routes. A pool or darts tournament /match is where the premises are hosting a game or match as part of a recognised inter pub tournament and not merely a made up tournament or match within the premises.
