## REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES (Contd.)

#### Structure, Governance and Management

#### Incorporation

The Company was incorporated on 18<sup>th</sup> April 2011 and was dormant until 31<sup>st</sup> May 2012. At that date, the activities, assets and liabilities of Peebles and District Citizens Advice Bureau, an unincorporated association, were transferred into the Company, which commenced operation as a charitable company.

#### Governing Document

The Company is limited by guarantee and does not have a Share Capital. It is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

#### **Trustees**

The Trustees were all members of the Management Committee of the Bureau. In addition, there are up to two co-opted members who represent broader community interests.

#### **Organisational Structure**

The Trustees are all members of a Board of Management that is responsible for the operation of the Bureau. Day to day operation is the responsibility of the Bureau Manager, who reports to the Board.

#### Risk Management

The Trustees exercise control of the Bureau through regular Board meetings. Regular activity reports are received from the Bureau Manager and from the Treasurer to enable the Trustees to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

The company's objects are to promote any charitable purposes for the public benefit in Tweeddale ("the area of local benefit") and elsewhere, by:

- 1. The advancement of education
- 2. The relief of those in need
- 3. The advancement of civil and human rights
- 4. Advancement of health
- 5. Advancement of community development
- 6. Advancement of common good

Where the objects are being promoted outwith the defined area of local benefit the Company may work with organisations with similar aims but shall at all times adhere to the agreed principles for the operation of Citizens Advice Bureau set out from time to time by the Scottish Association of Citizens Advice Bureau.

#### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES (Contd.)

#### Achievements and performance

During the year under review (2018-19) the Bureau had 1,868 contacts with clients (2017-18: 1,553) and dealt with 5,165 (4,665) issues. The confirmed client financial gains in the period amounted to £264,838 (£169,855). During the year the Bureau dealt with 65 (78) new debt cases, with a debt total of £258,152 (£467,598).

The Bureau operates in conjunction with the two other Bureaux operating within the Scottish Borders Region. A company, Borders Citizens Advice Consortium Ltd (BCAC) acts as a conduit for all funding received from Scottish Borders Council. The Bureaux work in partnership with the Council to review opportunities to expand provision of services and to deal with the changes to the welfare benefits system.

#### **Financial Review**

In addition to core funding grants from Scottish Borders Council the Bureau also receives funding via Citizens Advice Scotland to provide the Patients Advice and Support Services (PASS) for the Borders NHS region.

The Bureau recorded a decrease in funds arising from on-going activities of £3,293 in the year and has enough funds to continue to pursue its objectives.

#### Plans for Future Periods

The Bureau will continue to provide its generic advice and the PASS service. Scottish Borders Council has confirmed a continuation of core funding until March 2020. The amount received by the Bureau reduced by 6% in 2018-19. Negotiations have commenced in respect of the period beyond March 2020.

Citizens Advice Scotland holds the contract for PASS for the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2020. The Bureau is responsible for delivery of contracted services within the NHS Borders Region.

Additional funding was received during 2018-19 from Citizens Advice Scotland (CAS) and the Scottish Legal Aid Board (SLAB). This funding supported the Bureau in the provision of extra debt and welfare advice. This was further supplemented by funding from CAS to support "PensionWise" advice. The CAS debt and welfare funding will continue throughout 2019-20.

The Bureau expects to received funding to support CAS initiatives covering Financial Health checks and the role out of Universal Credit. The Bureau will continue to seek alternative funding sources to cover activity in 2019-20 and future years.

#### Reserves Policy

The Trustees have considered the nature of the operation of the company and concluded that it is not necessary to maintain a set level of reserves.

#### STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

The Trustees (who are also the Directors of Peebles and District Citizens Advice Bureau for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practise).

Company Law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP 2015 (FRS102);
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in business.

Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

## For the year ended 31st March 2019

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### (a) Accounting Convention

The Accounts have been prepared on the historical cost convention and in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (2015); the Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

## (b) Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objective of the Charity.

Restricted funds may be subject to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor.

## (c) Incoming resources

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on delivery of a specific performance by the charity are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant. Grants received in advance are treated as deferred income and recognised in the year in which they are being used.

Donated services are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.

#### (d) Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Cost of generation of funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

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#### (e) Taxation

The charitable company is exempt from Corporation Tax on its charitable activities.
