With regard to the above application and accompanying Operating Plan I wish to make the following late submission for the information of the Licensing Board.

Since submission of my original representation along with those of Police Scotland and the Health Board, I have had a discussion with the applicants representative in order to try and resolve the various concerns regarding the application. Along with Police Scotland and the Health Board and with the agreement of the applicant I would ask that the Licensing Board consider the application with the following amendments. If the amendments to the operating plan are accepted and the applicant gives the undertakings referred to then the previous representations can be disregarded.

The Proposed Operating Plan should be amended as follows:-

At Question 2 Core Hours.

Change the terminal hour on Sunday to 12 midnight.

At Question 6 Children and Young Persons.

Change the wording at 6(b) to read – "Children accompanied by an adult for the purpose of attending a pre-planned function or event.

Young persons for the same purpose but without the requirement for adult supervision"

Change the wording at 6(c) to read - " Children 0 to 15 years. Young Persons 16 and 17 years.

Change the wording at 6(d) to read - " For the duration of the function or event."

Change the wording at 6(e) to read - " All public areas."



Further to the above changes to the operating plan the applicant should undertake to have policies in place showing how they will meet all licensing objectives and in particular these should include a policy which ensures there is no noise nuisance caused at any neighbouring properties, in particular from amplified music.

The applicant should also undertake to give notice to the Licensing Authority of the type and scale of the planned events.
