Brief Summary : Pilot project to take 3 service users, 4 peer support workers and 2 staff members on an overnight trip to Edinburgh. The service users are in the 17-20 age range and have complex needs. The purpose of the trip is to determine the benefits to be gained from such an activity and to meet the needs of service users who have identified a desire to embark on short trips which they normally have no opportunity to undertake. The trip will involve educational and recreational activities such as a visit to the Royal Yacht Britannia, the National Museum and the Edinburgh Ghost Tour. On completion, the participants will compile a Photobook to provide a lasting reminder of their trip. The grant would contribute towards the cost of the accommodation and catering, activity, photobook and travel costs.

- 3. The organisation has submitted accounts to 31st March 2014 which have been checked and appear in order
- 4. The organisation has savings of £132,534 which is less than one full year's typical income of £270,169. Of the £132,534 savings, it should be noted that only £17,429 is unrestricted, the remainder being restricted to cover staffing, volunteers and general running costs of the organisation. Any organisation which has more savings than the amount of income it receives in a year and which is not set aside for a specific purpose is unlikely to receive a grant. This amount of savings satisfies the terms of the Community Grant Scheme
- 5. The organisation has submitted quotations which appear to be in order and support the costs requested
- 6. The application demonstrates a need for the project as many young people with learning difficulties

	do not have the opportunity to undertake such trips in the same way as their peers due to their
	complex needs. This is a pilot project which will determine the benefits of undertaking such activities
	for the future with the prospect of development into annual activity. Feedback from the participants
	and families regarding the benefits achieved will be used to develop a programme of activity based
	on learning if the trip is deemed to have been successful

	the first time. They have also been instrumental in determining which activities they took part in and
	the families involved are supportive of the activity
10.	The service users taking part have complex needs which and are liable to require assistance from
	Adult Learning Disability Services in the future
11.	The organisation has a Service Level Agreement with Social Work Services to deliver an adults
	befriending service to assist with short break respite and day care and this pilot project is a new
	activity aimed at addressing the needs of young people to reduce inequality and social isolation
12.	The organisation has provided a letter of support from the Work Placement Officer at Borders
	College who confirms that work placements have been offered to students in the Care and Access
	Faculty to enable them to complete practical elements to their courses. Many of the students have
	found involvement with the organisation very rewarding and have continued to volunteer at the end
	of their courses. She is supportive of the application and states she finds the organisation to be very
	caring, professional and inclusive

	towards running costs associated with activities and administration
14.	The organisation is unable to apply to Awards for All for funding for this project as it already has an
