

Community Planning Partnership Review: Update 18 November 2021

The Community Planning Partnership (CPP) Strategic Board agreed at its meeting on 9th September 2021 to a review of the Community Planning Partnership, and requested that this review is concluded by the end of 2021 with outcomes presented to the CPP Strategic Board in the Spring of 2022.

Since that meeting, officers have discussed a number of options with colleagues within the Improvement Service, and in line with work that is being undertaken by other CPP's across Scotland, we are proposing to hold a workshop for all CPP members in January. This will be facilitated by the Improvement Service and will focus on capturing and reflecting the learning from Covid-19, the strengths and weaknesses of the current arrangements, resources, priorities, performance monitoring and will also consider the refresh of the Community Plan & Action Plan.

A self-assessment questionnaire will be issued by the end of November which will provide essential information in relation to developing the agenda of the proposed workshop. This questionnaire will be issued to all members of the Joint Programme Board and the Strategic Board by the end of November, and can be completed and submitted separately or as one organisational response. The questionnaire will be required to be completed by mid-December, to allow analysis and development of the agenda ahead of the January workshop.

The proposed outcome of the workshop will be a draft Scottish Borders CPP Improvement Plan that will be brought back to the Board for approval.

Recommendation:

The CPP Strategic Board agrees to a workshop being held in January to progress the Review, and that a questionnaire is issued at the end of November and submitted by CPP members by mid-December.
