## SCOTTISH BORDERS LICENSING BOARD-FESTIVE HOURS 2022/23

I submit this report for consideration by Scottish Borders Licensing Board

**Board's Policy Terminal Hours** - Sunday to Wednesday midnight; Thursday to Saturday 1.00am.

## **Boards Festive Season Policy**

The vast majority of licensed premises in the Scottish Borders have a seasonal variation included in their Operating Plans allowing a terminal hour of 1.00am on the following days – Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Eve and New Year's Day.

For 2022/23, Christmas Eve and New Years' Eve are on Saturdays with Christmas Day and New Years Day being a Sunday and Boxing Day being a Monday.

In relation to Christmas Day, New Years' Day and Boxing Day, as in previous years, it would seem appropriate to allow the premises who do not have this seasonal variation to apply for an extension to their core hours up to the same terminal hour (1am) on these days and for those applications to be dealt with under delegated powers where no other objections or representations are received. In the case of those applications that attract objections or representations, they would be referred to the Board for a decision as required by legislation.

In addition, it would seem appropriate that the same policy is applied to events being catered for in unlicensed premises by way of Occasional Licences.

## Night Club/Late Hours Premises

Again, as in previous years and with regard to consistency, it is suggested that it would be appropriate to allow night club premises to apply for extensions to their existing hours on Christmas Day, New Years' Day and Boxing Day allowing them to trade to their usual core weekend hours. This preserves the normal weekend time differential between specific late night venues and other licensed premises. Again, any extended hours applications for Christmas Day, New Years' Day and Boxing Day could be dealt with under delegated powers only where no other objections or representations are received. In a case of an application attracting objections or representations, it would be referred to the Board for a decision as required by legislation.

## **Applications for Other Hours**

Any applications for a terminal hour other than for the days or late times stated above would be referred to the Board for a decision on their own individual merits
