Summarise what you want to use this funding for (max. 100 words)

The funding will enable LMP to fully recover from the losses caused by Covid lockdowns and restrictions. Although we received support from government and SBC, we still had considerable wages costs and fixed costs such as insurance and pool costs (eg heating, chemical dosing and water circulation) to maintain the safety of the structure and the pool.

Covid recovery grants finished in August 2021 but we continued to have restrictions until April 2022, thus limiting the numbers of people allowed to use the facility. In the interests of peoples' health and wellbeing we opened as soon as permitted. Our major problem now is our electricity bill has increased from £18,000 to £50,000 a year.

We will be able to continue to provide an essential health, wellbeing, and water safety service to the people of Jedburgh as follows:

Over 60,000 visits a year to our swimming pool and gym.

Taught 600 children to swim since April and still have a waiting list to overcome a backlog due to Covid lockdowns and restrictions.

Provide swimming to local schools at a charge of only £1 per pupil.

Run 14 Mother and Baby sessions in the pool a week.

Also, we provide on behalf of the town:

Cleaning the Public Toilets which are open from 6am to 8pm every day of the year.

Facilitate and administer the employment of a Development Worker.

In the year prior to Covid we made a surplus of £20,000. To recover from our current problem, we are taking the following actions :

Increase usage prices by 10%, with discounts for young and older people and those on benefits (33% of our postcodes are in Quintile 2 of SIMD, the 2nd most deprived group)

Make a public appeal for donations.

Operate a lottery.

These actions are being organised now and will ensure the future of a major asset of the town.

Common Good Funds
Common Good Funds in Scotland originated in the 15th century and are the assets and income of some of the former Burghs. They can represent a substantial portfolio of land, property, some moveable items and investments and by law continue to exist for the benefit of the inhabitants of the former Burghs to which they relate. Scottish Borders Council is the owner of these Funds and each Fund has a sub-committee comprising the relevant local Councillors who make the decisions on the management of the Fund's assets and approval of any requests for funding (up to a limit of £20,000 above which full Council approval is required).

If you are successful in being awarding Common Good Funds, you will be asked to complete a monitoring & evaluation form when your project is complete or within 1 year of receiving funding. Future applications will not be considered until this has been received and the Common Good Fund

Sub-Committee are satisfied with the evaluation you have provided.
