**Comment Reasons:** 

- Road safety

Comment: This fence has already been erected, so presumably this application is retrospective. The new fence, which is essentially solid in nature, significantly restricts sight lines in both directions, on what is already a dangerous corner.

When travelling westwards on the B7062 towards Peebles the line of sight on the inside of the bend at Scotsmill is now limited by the new fence, such that oncoming vehicles are seen later than previously. This will be particularly dangerous in winter given the propensity for icing on that section of the road, and the adverse camber which makes braking difficult. Furthermore the new fence limits the ability of drivers to see vehicles emerging from the new access which forms part of this application.

When travelling eastwards towards Kailzie the new fence also limits the ability of drivers to see oncoming traffic, this being particularly dangerous when vehicles, such as delivery vans, are parked at the Millers House and oncoming vehicles are required to move to the right hand side of the road.

In the interests of road safety this proposal should be rejected.
