<b>Services/functions covered by this Direction</b>	Adult Social Care
<b>Full text of the Direction</b>	<p>The Scottish Borders Council is directed to undertake a further pathfinder in the Duns area for the night support service. As part of this, it is expected that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The 'Ways of working' of the HSCP will be adopted</li> <li>- An enabling approach will be taken</li> <li>- Service users will be consulted and engaged with</li> <li>- Staff will be supported</li> <li>- Appropriate supports (e.g. Assistive Technology / Technology Enabled Care / on-call) and reassurance will be provided,</li> <li>- Appropriate continued mitigation to concerns is provided and;</li> <li>- The Integrated Impact Assessment will be updated in a dynamic way as part of the management of the project</li> </ul>
<b>Timeframes</b>	To start by: As soon as possible

<b>Budget / finances allocated to carry out the detail</b>	This will be covered by the budget and the financial plan.
<b>Outcomes / Performance Measures</b>	<p>Improve the experience for service users by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Minimising disruption overnight</li> <li>- Preventing confusion and disorientation</li> <li>- Promoting sleep</li> <li>- Giving increased choice and sense of control to service users</li> <li>- Improves service user safety by providing constant monitoring rather than a time-limited face to face visit</li> <li>- Allows for an immediate response in the event there is a serious concern with a service user in need of urgent assistance</li> </ul> <p>This aligns to the following National Health and Wellbeing Outcomes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- People, including those with disabilities or long term conditions, or who are frail, are able to live, as far as reasonably practicable, independently and at home or in a homely setting in their community.</li> <li>- People who use health and social care services have positive experiences of those services, and have their dignity respected.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Health and social care services are centred on helping to maintain or improve the quality of life of people who use those services.</li><li>- People who use health and social care services are safe from harm.</li><li>- Resources are used effectively and efficiently in the provision of health and social care services</li></ul> <p>It is expected that through redesign across the Borders, that the reinvestment opportunity to increase Care at Home capacity would be in the region of £450,000 per annum. This will need to be reviewed by the IJB prior to decision.</p>
