REASON FOR DECISION

Subject to compliance with the schedule of planning conditions, the proposed development will accord with Approved Scottish Borders Structure Plan Policies E13 and I11, and Adopted Scottish Borders Local Plan Policies ED1,G1, G7 and Inf4.

SCHEDULE OF CONDITIONS

- The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of three years from the date of this permission.

 Peason: To comply with Section 58 of the Town and Country Planning (Section) Act 1997.
 - Reason: To comply with Section 58 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997, as amended by the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006.
- The use of the business premises hereby approved shall be limited to Classes 2 and 4 of the Town & Country Planning (Scotland) Use Classes Order 1997, as amended, and shall not be used for any other Use Class (including Use Class 1) without the express written consent of the Planning Authority.
 - Reason: To ensure that the business use of the site is appropriate for this locality.

N.B: This permission does not include any consent, approval or licence necessary for the proposed development under the building regulations or any other statutory enactment and the development should not be commenced until all consents are obtained.

Notice of Initiation of Development

Section 27 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act (as amended) requires that any person who has been granted planning permission (including planning permission in principle) and intends to start development must, once they have decided the date they will start work on the development, inform the planning authority of that date as soon as is practicable. A form is enclosed with this decision notice for this purpose.

Notice of Completion of Development

Section 27B requires that any person who completes a development for which planning permission (including planning permission in principle) has been given must, as soon as practicable after doing so, give notice of completion to the planning authority.

When planning permission is granted for phased development then under section 27B(2) the permission is to be granted subject to a condition that as soon as practicable after each phase, other

than the last, is completed, the person carrying out the development is to give notice of that completion to the planning authority.

If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the Planning Authority to refuse planning permission for or approval required by a condition in respect of the proposed development, or to grant permission or approval subject to conditions, the applicant may require the planning authority to review the case under Section 43A of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 within three months from the date of this notice. The notice of review should be addressed to Corporate Administration, Council Headquarters, Newtown St Boswells, Melrose TD6 OSA.

If permission to develop land is refused or granted subject to conditions, whether by the Planning Authority or by the Scottish Ministers, and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonably beneficial use in its existing state and cannot be rendered capable of reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted, the owner may serve on the Planning Authority a purchase notice requiring the purchase of his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Part 5 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997.
